2018 Muster Speaker

Honorable Will Hurd '99

The Honorable Will Hurd '99 serves as the U.S. representative for Texas's 23rd congressional district. Hurd's district stretches for eight hundred miles, from San Antonio to El Paso, along the Mexican border. He holds the distinction of being the first African-American Republican elected to Congress from Texas.



Hurd is the vice-chair of the Border and Maritime Subcommittee of the Homeland Security Committee and was appointed to the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence for his second term.

Prior to being elected to Congress, Hurd worked for the CIA for nine years, stationed in Washington D.C., including a tour of duty as an operations officer in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and India. He speaks Urdu, the national language and lingua franca of Pakistan, where he worked under cover.

Hurd attended John Marshall High School in the San Antonio suburb of Leon Valley. He then attended Texas A&M, where he served as student body president in 1999. He graduated in 2000 with a degree in computer science and a minor in international relations.
